Foundation Director's Report

The Adelaide Parks Rotary Club has supported the Rotary Foundation in many ways over the years. This year I decided to make an effort to increase the donations given to The Foundation by encouraging Rotarians to join the Centurion Club. I am pleased to say the vast majority of members of Adelaide Parks Rotary Club are now members of the Centurion Club. My aim was 100% membership, which was not achieved, but we came close. Several members have donated a lot more than \$100 and have done so for many years. They are to be commended for being such great supporters of our very own charity.

We have also contributed to The Rotary Foundation by way of awarding Paul Harris Fellowships to two of our members, as of writing, and three more will be surprised recipients at the Changeover Dinner. This amounts to US\$7500 and we can all feel proud that we are helping to eliminate Polio from the world as well as other things.

Polio Pig (The Pink One) has been on the tables at meetings every week and members have put their change in as another simple way of contributing to the Foundation.

The Rotary Foundation is the charitable arm of Rotary International and is supported solely by contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation through Foundation grants, Rotarians are able to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

As the Foundation Director my role has been to develop and implement a plan to support The Foundation through participation in grant projects and activities and through financial contributions. The usage of debit cards for purchasing the BBQ items improves the efficiency of the process for reimbursement and monthly bank reconciliation.

We will continue to work hard for 18-19 and focus on budget.

Australian Awards Fellowship Report – Jim Davies

The Rotary Club of Adelaide Parks was successful in being awarded an Australian Awards Fellowship Grant to support teachers in GIFT Foundation schools in Tamil Nadu, India.

The objectives and expected outcomes for the Fellowship were achieved as follows:

Development of leadership and organisational capacity.

Development of educational leadership capacity, particularly with women in AGN and APPU Arivaalayem Schools was a first order priority outcome for this fellowship. This was achieved via observation of and mentoring from women principals in visited schools and significantly enhanced through Fellows participation in 'The integral Leader Workshop' conducted by Leaders Institute of South Australia.

Educational leadership

This focusing objective was to enhance the Fellows educational leadership through improving the quality of teaching for enhancement of student learning, with particular emphasis on the participation of girls, improvement of teaching methods, use of computer- aided learning tools and inquiry driven, activity-based teaching methodologies. All focus areas were experienced by the Fellows through their observation visits to schools in SA and were further enhanced via three workshops. The workshops were 'Teaching for Effective Learning' (SA Education Department); 'Behaviour at School Study' (Assoc. Professor Anna Sullivan, UniSA); Child Protection Workshop (SA Education Department).

Leading innovation, change and development

The Fellowship activities were carefully designed to provide intensive professional learning for the Fellows followed by mentoring to support application of learned professional practices in the schools. Improved capacity to lead innovation and change was an intended outcome. Performance improvement across staff of the two schools has been reported by the Counterpart organisation (GIFT Foundation) and observed by the mentor from the Rotary Club of Adelaide Parks when undertaking the partner country activities.

Learning outcomes

A key focus of the Fellowship program was to improve literacy across the GIFT Foundation schools (AGN and APPU Arivaalayem Schools). Literacy development was a priority attended to in all school visits and particularly at Gilles Street Primary School and its program for children arriving in Australia with a non-English speaking background. Literacy teaching methodologies that Fellows observed in SA schools were observed by the mentor when undertaking the partner country activities and were evident in classrooms beyond those of the Fellows.

Summary

Improved educational leadership capability and capacity has been reported by the counterpart organisation, the GIFT Foundation. The Fellowship has resulted in positive impact on the quality of education provided by the schools. Furthermore, through the mentoring activities and observation on-site in India there is a firmly held understanding that continued effort to improve young people's education is a necessary precursor for reducing poverty, improving employability and sustaining economic and social development.

Webmaster's Report

2018 saw Rotary Adelaide Parks develop a new web presence via a relaunch of the clubs web page and the introduction of a social media presence via Facebook. The budget for this activity was capped at aud600 with total expenses being aud250.

The web presence was been very successful with the webpage rating at number 2 for Google searches using keywords Rotary, Adelaide, Clubs, etc compared to the previous web presence which didn't rate in the first 200 pages of a Google search.

The website is averaging 65 new hits a month and has yielded 6 guest speakers and 4 visitors from other Rotary clubs around the world. In part this can be attributable to a simple contact form which enables a greatly improved communication path.

Monthly monitoring and reporting has been provided to board members by using Google analytics for the website

The Facebook page has archived 34 followers with individual posts range from 18 to 500 hits per post. On average two new posts are added to the Facebook site every week with most support for the Facebook page coming from external (non club members) so it is external posts that are having the most impact in this domain and therefor the higher hit rate.

Local club members show very little support for the Facebook site with very limited contributions, very few likes and almost zero shares. This seems to be a factor of the general age group of our club membership rather than any other reasons.

In the second half of the year there has been an increase in cross-club promotion via the website and Facebook with a view that we are all just one big family. This includes other Rotary and Rotaract clubs.

Two new Potential members attend club meetings during the year but they elected not to continue.
