This Rotary year we had 2 successful applicants for the National Youth Science Forum. Dasith Wewegama and Hattie Huang passed the District Interview with flying colours. Dasith was a year 11 student at Adelaide High School and Hattie was from Glenunga International High School. We transferred Hattie's application back to District Committee to pass on to another club. We supported Dasith's application with almost total funding.

Dasith returned to our club during February to give the club a most interesting summary of his experiences at the NYSF programme in Perth.

2 new applications for the 2014 NYSF have been received from Glenunga International High School and club interviews will take place shortly.

Once again we thank Paul Cavell and wife Julie for their support of these youth projects.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE REPORT – Director Bob Congdon

AGN School Project

In 2009 the Board of the Rotary Club of Adelaide Parks received a project proposal advocating the creation of student scholarships to a school in rural Tamil Nadu, Southern India. This proposal was adopted by the club. Subsequently the Adelaide Parks Board applied for and received a Simplified District Grant. The Rotary Foundation has continued to support this project since its commencement. Students are selected prior to the opening of each academic year and Foundation Grants applications are made to support the Project.

Background

The AGN School in the state of Tamil Nadu, India, provides education from kindergarten to 12th year to rural students from an area within a 15km radius of the village of Konganapuram. The AGN School was established in 1998 in a small farm house in the village of Konganapuram. Since then the school has grown. It now occupies new and modern premises, offering a syllabus which meets state education department requirements to a student population of 1400. The school offers education to paying students and also scholarships to a small number (approx. 8%) of students.

This school has responded to an existing need for locally accessible quality education for children living in an underprivileged rural environment. The school has succeeded in sustaining a high standard of education while managing high growth and continuing financial viability.

RC of Adelaide Parks Goal

To facilitate the attendance of talented students of limited means at AGN School through years nine through twelve. Covering all education, accommodation and associated school costs. The expectation is that through this high quality education assistance students will then go on to successfully complete tertiary studies.

It is anticipated that these students will eventually return to their respective rural communities and contribute their professional skills and expertise for the betterment of these communities.

Current Situation/Successes



There are presently seven students on scholarships at present. A further three students (one, a carryover from 2012) will commenced in late July 2013. All students are performing well.

An outstanding achievement by our scholarship student Sridhara Manikam occurred in 2012. Sridhara was placed equal third in the state of Tamil Nadu Year ten examinations. This was particularly notable in that 1.1 Million students sat for these examinations.

District Simplified Grant

A successful application was made for a grant made in mid 2012 to be applied in commencement year 2013. An amount of USD \$2,103 was granted.

Rotary Club of Adelaide Parks

The Club contribution (at current exch. rate) is USD\$5,855 or AUD\$5,328 will cover the balance of the cost of the scholarship program for 2013.

Summary

*One student (2012 commencement) withdrew in mid 2012 due to difficulty with instruction in English. The total funds for this student have been held over and have been used to fund an additional student for commencement this year.

The AGN School continues to provide regular feedback on student performance .

Hospital Equipment Shipment to the Congo

(This Important project was lead by Paul Cavell.)

Among many interesting guest speakers this year we were particularly impressed by Dr. Luc Muliambalimbia who was brought to the attention of the club by the Zonta Club of Adelaide Hills.

Recognizing the dire circumstances of his home village in the Congo Dr. Luc resigned from his UN post in Africa to focus on helping his own people. Here he found that a new hospital lacked adequate furnishing (beds etc.) and equipment which it urgently needed to make it a fully operational facility.

The Rotary Club of Adelaide Parks, with its access to the District operated Donations In Kind Facility at Edinburgh Park, agreed to work in conjunction with the Zonta Club of Adelaide Hills and the Birthing Kit Foundation to source needed hospital beds, furnishings, and equipment. Rotarians from RC of Adelaide Parks together with volunteers from Zonta and the Birthing Kit Foundation consolidated the equipment supplied by Donations In Kind with birthing kits and clothing supplied by Zonta and the Birthing Kit Foundation and packed the consignment into a

forty foot container which was subsequently shipped to the Congo. Equipment shipped included :-
