Fundraising has been central to our ability to support our projects and Programs. All members have contributed to ensuring that our service activities have been successful.

Community Service –

- We supported the Rotary Club of Elizabeth with their **BBQs at Parafield Airport** for the first 6 months of 2017 and raised over \$1000

- RCAP considers that **The Smith Family** is one of their preferred charities and this year donated \$2030 for educational scholarships for disadvantaged students.

- **The Christmas Raffle** - organised by Anne Crawford and Keith Pearson with a great range of wine as prizes raised over \$4000.
- **The Weekly Raffle** – prizes donated by members each week **raised \$1723**

- **Christmas Hampers**- 5 hampers were purchased and delivered to disadvantaged families at Christmas – Thanks John Hicks.
- **Entertainment Books** – an annual commitment of the sale of books through online and cash sales – Thanks Jim Davies and John Hicks
- **St Luke's Centre for the Homeless** – Anne Crawford regularly takes non perishable items to support the centre and organises a Sunday Fundraiser in November each year
- **Carousel Volunteering** – Thanks Keith Pearson for organising help for the Carousel at Semaphore Beach
- **Hutt Street Centre** – Members participated in their annual fundraiser 'Walk a Mile in My Boots'
- **Kick Start for Kids** – Lesley Sparkes continued negotiating with Kick Start to help with food for disadvantaged school children

National and International Service –

Again our support has gone to –

- **Polio Eradication** – Each week members add small change to the ‘pink pig’ and this year we raised \$271
- **The AGN School** – Bob Condon has provided a report. (see below). This project is continuing to provide an excellent education for young talented Indians who would not normally have an opportunity to go on to tertiary studies. The fulfilment brought to the individuals and the economic contribution to India in the years ahead will be significant. It was clear that financial support from Rotary, beyond that provided by our immediate club, would not be expected in future. An amount of USD\$1480 was sent to cover one scholarship. RCAP began considering the viability of this project beyond 2016-2017.
- **RYLA** - \$850 was contributed for Jason Liao to attend.

- **Disaster Aid Australia** – We continue to support DAA through the work of Dave Tuzewski and Lesley Sparkes and have contributed \$1000 for water filtration systems.

AGN School's Report By Bob Congdon

The AGN scholarship program commenced in 2010 has since that time has delivered a worthwhile benefit to 17 students. Without exception those students who have completed their scholarships have gone on to tertiary education in such fields as medicine, engineering accounting, and education. These scholarships were only made available to students of limited means. It is gratifying to know that the club's contribution has meant that these and future students when professionally skilled people will be able to contribute the benefit of their communities to the full extent of their talent.

Without the support of district grants our club, now of reduced membership, has been unable to continue with this program. However, the initiative and hard work of President elect, Jim Davies, resulted in a major grant from the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade in the form of funding for the Australian Fellowship program. The objective of this program is leadership in education especially for women teachers at the AGN and APPU VAALEM Schools. In the initial phase of this program 3 senior women teachers came to Australia in October 2017. Potentially this program will continue for a further two years.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Financial Statements consisting of the Administration Account, Service Account and Balance Sheet are attached. (**Attachment B**)

The **Administration Account** shows a Net Income of \$5371, the profit arose is mainly from Fines (\$1157) and the Weekly Raffle (\$1,435). There are no unusual items in the Administration Account.

The **Service Account** shows a net loss of \$2273. This is after paying for only one Overseas Scholarship to the AGN School at a cost of \$AU1000 (as a result of a having a credit for one student). Also an unexpected income was received from the Elizabeth Rotary Club BBQ's

All subscriptions to Rotary International, Rotary Down Under and to District 9500 were paid in full.

Cash at Bank stands at \$35,387 with \$27,882 in the Business Cash Maximiser account and \$7,505 in the Daily Banking account.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION **by Keith Pearson**

The Rotary Foundation (TRF) of Rotary International was established by Arch Klumph, “To do good in the world”, the mission of TRF, is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education and the alleviation of poverty. Our Foundation is our own charity to nourish and support.. This year we have done this in a variety of ways including increasing our membership of the Centurion Club.

The District 9500 (our District) Centurion Club (EREY) is a convenient and personal way to support the Humanitarian Work of TRF to alleviate poverty, educate the illiterate and reverse disease by donating \$100 or more every year, for as long as we are able. These contributions are paid into The Australian Rotary Foundation Trust (not to the USA) and are tax deductible. We have contributed to the eradication of polio - ‘End Polio Now’ - via our Pink Pig donations on a weekly basis as in previous years.

The Paul Harris Fellow is a recognition, not an award. Anyone who contributes - or in whose name is contributed - a gift of US\$1000 or more to the Annual Programs Fund or Polio Eradication may become a Paul Harris Fellow. Each new PHF receives a commemorative certificate and a Paul Harris Fellow pin. Donors are eligible for PHF recognition when their cumulative giving reaches US\$1000. Each year the Board considers presenting a recognition to either a member of the club or a worthy person in the local community. We now have a high percentage of members in the Centurion Club and I would like to thank them for their continued generosity.

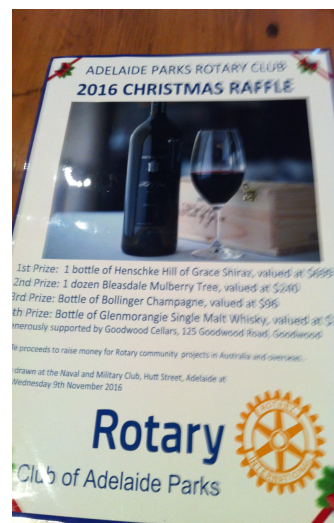
